Making Butterbeer

INGREDIENTS

- 4 cans cream soda
- 100 g butterscotch syrup
- 250 ml double cream
- 2 tbsp. sugar
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
- 50 g butter, melted

DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a large bowl, combine cream soda and butterscotch syrup and stir.
- 2. In a stand mixer fitted with a whisk attachment, beat cream until stiff peaks form. Fold in sugar and vanilla extract, then melted butter until no longer streaky. (Add more butter if desired).
- 3. Ladle Butterbeer into glasses and top with whipped cream mixture.

Butterbeer Pudding Cookies (Butterscotch)

Ingredients

3/4 cup butter, softened

1 cup granulated sugar

1 egg, plus 1 yolk

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 (3.5 ounce packet) instant butterscotch pudding mix

2 cups flour

1 cup butterscotch chips

Preheat oven to 350°F.

Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper and set aside.

Beat the butter and sugar for 2 minutes with mixer on medium. Add in egg, vanilla, baking soda and salt. Mix until combined, scraping the sides of bowl as needed. Beat in the pudding mix for about 30 seconds.

With mixer on low, add in the flour, mixing until combined. Finally, add chips and mix until distributed.

Use a medium sized cookie scoop to scoop cookies. Either roll cookies for a "neater" look or drop dough right from scoop (for a more natural/rustic look) onto the prepared baking sheet 2 inches apart. Bake for 8-10 minutes until cookies are almost set. Do not over-bake or your cookies won't be as soft as intended.

Allow cookies to cool on cookie sheet for about 5 minutes before moving to a wire rack to cool completely.









Materials:

- Collect a variety of jars and bottles (the more unusual the shape, the better)
- Red, Yellow and Blue food dye (with these three you can mix the other colours)
- Glitter, beads, leaves, flowers or petals collected from the garden, small shells or pebbles, sand, grass, bubble bath.
- Old corks
- Ribbon (different colours)
- Potion labels (print out, see below, or make your own)
- Glue to stick on labels

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- 1. Clean out bottles and jars.
- 2. Decide on label or create your own.
- 3. Put items you want in potion (leaves, beads, glitter etc). Remember not all potions need to be liquid... have some dry, sand and grass for example or feathers.
- 4. Decide on colour you would like, remember if you put in all colours you will end up with brown. You will only need a little of the food dye then add water.
- 5. Use cork as the stopper to the bottle, you may need an adult to cut away a bit of the cork so that it will fit. You can of course just put lid back on.
- 6. Making sure the outside of the bottle is completely dry, stick the label on using the glue.
- 7. Decorate with ribbon and whatever else you may have, like star stickers etc.

Make as many potions as you want. Using a box, you could make a carrying case for all your potions.

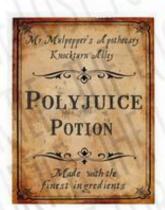
Safety tip: Please make sure that the lids or corks are fastened well and keep the bottles away from other younger children who may drink it by mistake.











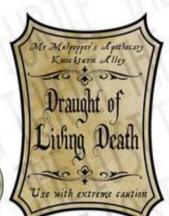






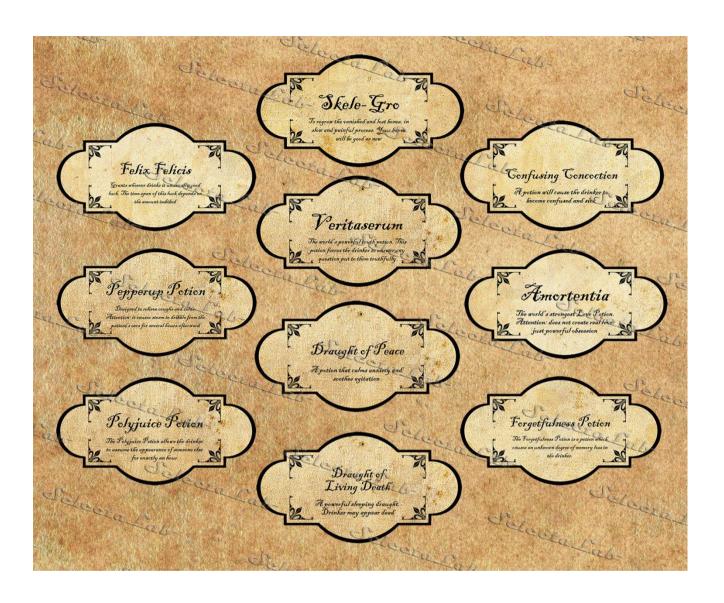










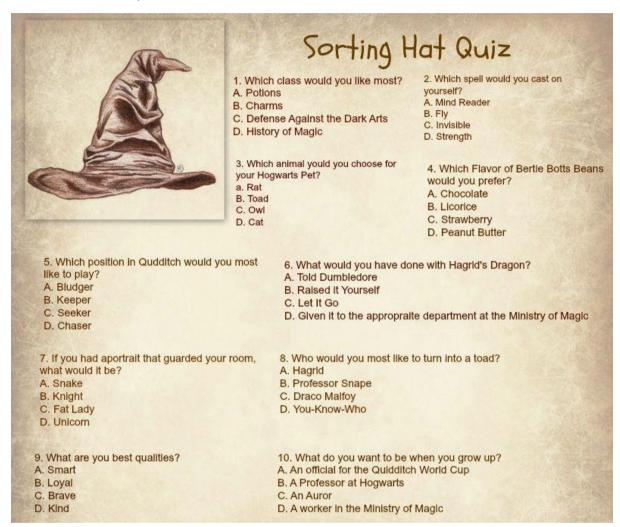


You could also make yourself a little potion making book with instructions on making different potions.
