Junk model musical instruments

#### **Guitar/string instrument**

#### Materials

- Various junk materials (see pictures)
- Tissue box, other small boxes or plastic pots
- Cardboard from cardboard box
- Elastic bands
- String, wool, cotton etc.
- Paint, colouring pens, coloured paper
- Sticky tape/glue
- Wooden ice lolly pop sticks













## Shakers/marakas

#### Materials

- Plastic bottles
- Egg cartons
- Plastic yogurt pots
- Card
- Lolly pop sticks
- Rice or beads or small pebbles or old buttons
- Cardboard tubes
- Coloured tape and paper for decorating













# Rainstick

## Materials

- Long cardboard tube (from tin foil)
- Rice
- Pipe cleaners or scrunched up foil in long strips that have been curled up into a long, loose spring.
- Elastic bands or string or wool
- Paper bags or plastic for ends of tube.

# Instructions

- Decorate the tube as desired with paint or sticking tape or paper, beads etc.
- Place paper bag on one end of tube and fasten with elastic bands or string, you can use coloured wool to decorate
- Use coiled up pipe cleaners or foil and feed it in the inside of the tube running the whole length of the tube
- Add rice
- Cover the top end of tube with bag and elastic band
- Ensure both ends of the tube are secure otherwise rice will spill out
- Turn tube and listen to rice cascade down the tube down the coiled foil which makes the sound of rain.

- tape








# Xylophone

#### Drums

# Materials

- plastic pots/boxes different sizes/ tin cans (ensure that there are no sharp areas), pringles pot, ice cream tubs
- cling film
- balloons
- pencils, chop sticks or straws for drum sticks
- elastic bands
- corks (for making drumstick tip)

Make sure you clear a space in which you can move around without knocking into things Think up some different moves using different parts of your body:


- Your head- nod it, swing it
